Course taught in English

1. Stages of the procedure

To be admitted to the programme, you must:

- a. **Pay** the fee of €10.00 in accordance with the procedures and deadlines set out in point 3.
- b. **Wait for the outcome** of the eligibility check. **If you do not meet the entry requirements**, you may acquire the missing credits by passing single examinations.
The procedures and costs are set out in the section 'Single Examinations' of the Regulations for Attendance at Bachelor's and Master's Degree Programmes and for Student Fees

- c. **Carry out the personal skills assessment** in accordance with the procedures set out in point 4.
- d. **Proceed with enrolment** by paying the course enrolment fees in accordance with the procedures and deadlines set out in point 5.
Enrolment can only take place once the Student Affairs Office has sent an email confirming the successful outcome of the eligibility and personal knowledge checks.

For students coming from other Italian universities

Students coming from other Italian universities must, after paying €10.00, submit a self-declaration stating the exams they have taken, the scientific-disciplinary sectors corresponding to the courses, and the relevant syllabuses, using the form "Dichiarazione laurea ed esami per verifica dei requisiti" available on the University website, on the student forms page

The declaration must be submitted in one of the following ways:

- from the email address provided on Infostud at the time of registration, to the email address of your Student Affairs Office or to the address specified in the curriculum requirements, available in the degree programme catalogue on the page for each programme under the 'Enrolment' section. Before submitting your application, you must check that you have uploaded your identity document to Infostud, under 'Profile > Personal Documents';

- from your certified email address to Sapienza's certified email address protocollosapienza@cert.uniroma1.it

For students who have not yet obtained their degree

Where the course regulations so provide, students who have not yet obtained their degree (at Sapienza or at other universities) may also apply for verification of their eligibility, subject to the requirement to obtain it by 23 January 2027 (for students who have not yet obtained their degree at Sapienza) and by 19 December 2026 (for students who have not yet obtained their degree from other Italian or international universities).

For students from abroad and/or holding a qualification obtained within a foreign education system

The procedures for students from abroad are set out in point 6.

2. Admission requirements

Students wishing to enrol on the Master's degree programme in Space and Astronautical Engineering must hold a three-year bachelor's degree or another qualification obtained in Italy or abroad and recognised as suitable under current legislation, and must meet specific academic and personal requirements.

As this is an international programme taught in English, proof of B2 level or equivalent proficiency in English is required for admission.

If this certification is not held at the time of enrolment, it may be obtained during the first year, including through courses offered by the Faculty of Civil and Industrial Engineering.

1) Students who hold an Italian degree awarded under the regulations set out in Ministerial Decree 270/04 or Ministerial Decree 509/99

• Academic requirements

a) For students with a weighted average – calculated on the basis of all credits with marks out of 30 acquired and valid for the award of the first-level degree – equal to or greater than 22/30 and less than 24/30, the academic requirements are:

- attainment of a minimum number of CFU in the following SSD subject areas:

b) For students with a weighted average of 24/30 or higher but less than 26/30, the required academic criteria are:

- attainment of a minimum number of CFU in the following SSD subject areas:

c) For students with a weighted average of 26/30 or higher, the academic requirements are the attainment of a minimum number of CFU in the following SSD areas:

Note: students who do not meet the requirements must take the single examinations assigned by the Admissions Committee.

Students falling under points (b) and (c) are advised to compare their CV with the Academic Regulations for the degree programme in Aerospace Engineering and with the Syllabus (set out in the Academic Regulations for the Space and Astronautical Engineering degree programme), and to adapt their preparation accordingly.

The academic requirements for admission are automatically met by:

- students holding a degree in Aerospace Engineering from class L-9 'Aerospace Engineering' (Ministerial Decree 270/04) awarded by the University of Rome 'Sapienza'
- students holding a three-year degree in Aerospace Engineering (class L-10 'Aerospace Engineering') under Ministerial Decree 509/99, obtained from the University of Rome 'Sapienza'.

2) Students holding a qualification obtained abroad or an Italian qualification under a system different from those set out in Ministerial Decree 270/04 or Ministerial Decree 509/99

The assessment of individual knowledge and academic qualifications will be carried out by the Admissions Committee, which will examine the applicant's academic record, personal motivation and other supporting documents submitted, such as periods of study abroad, work placements and professional experience. All applicants may be invited by the Admissions Committee to attend an interview.

3. Verification of eligibility

Eligibility checks must be requested by paying a €10.00 fee from 2 July 2026 and by one of the following dates, as chosen:

- 15 September 2026 (the only applicable date for applicants from non-EU countries requiring a student visa)
- 15 October 2026
- 17 November 2026
- 17 December 2026
- 14 January 2027 (date reserved for students who have already graduated from Sapienza or are about to graduate).

The payment is generated via the Infostud system.

The result of the eligibility check will be sent to your institutional email account (if active) or to the personal email address provided on Infostud.

4. Assessment of personal knowledge

Applicants are eligible if their weighted average mark for their first-cycle degree is 22/30 or higher.

The adequacy of an applicant's academic background is assessed on the basis of meeting a minimum threshold for the weighted average mark achieved in their first-cycle degree. The criteria and procedures for this assessment are set out in the programme's academic regulations.

Furthermore, a good command of the English language, both written and spoken, is required, corresponding to level B2 (CEFR – Common European Framework of Reference for Languages), which must be attested by a specific certificate or through an assessment of this

proficiency, to be carried out in accordance with the procedures set out in the programme's academic regulations.

Applications for admission from candidates holding a qualification obtained abroad or an Italian qualification under a system other than those governed by Ministerial Decree 270/04 or Ministerial Decree 509/99 are assessed on the basis of their academic background and the results achieved.

The procedures for assessing the adequacy of an applicant's academic background – which are available only to those who meet the academic requirements – are set out in the Academic Regulations, available on the degree programme's website.

5. Enrolment
