Admission procedure for the Master's degree programme
with assessment of entry requirements and personal knowledge in

Ingegneria Chimica Chemical Engineering

Faculty of Civil and Industrial Engineering

1. Stages of the procedure

To be admitted to the programme, you must:

- a. **Pay** the fee of €10.00 in accordance with the procedures and deadlines set out in point 3.
- b. **Wait for the outcome** of the eligibility check. **If you do not meet the entry requirements**, you may acquire the missing credits by passing single examinations.
The procedures and costs are set out in the section 'Single Examinations' of the Regulations for Attendance at Bachelor's and Master's Degree Programmes and for Student Fees

- c. **Carry out the personal skills assessment** in accordance with the procedures set out in point 4.
- d. **Proceed with enrolment** by paying the course enrolment fees in accordance with the procedures and deadlines set out in point 5.
Enrolment can only take place once the Student Affairs Office has sent an email confirming the successful outcome of the eligibility and personal knowledge checks.

For students coming from other Italian universities

Students coming from other Italian universities must, after paying €10.00, submit a self-declaration stating the exams they have taken, the scientific-disciplinary sectors corresponding to the courses, and the relevant syllabuses, using the form "Dichiarazione laurea ed esami per verifica dei requisiti" available on the University website, on the student forms page

The declaration must be submitted in one of the following ways:

- from the email address provided on Infostud at the time of registration, to the email address of your Student Affairs Office or to the address specified in the curriculum requirements, available in the degree programme catalogue on the page for each programme under the 'Enrolment' section. Before submitting your application, you

must check that you have uploaded your identity document to Infostud, under 'Profile > Personal Documents';

- from your certified email address to Sapienza's certified email address protocollosapienza@cert.uniroma1.it

For students who have not yet obtained their degree

Where the course regulations so provide, students who have not yet obtained their degree (at Sapienza or at other universities) may also apply for verification of their eligibility, subject to the requirement to obtain it by 23 January 2027 (for students who have not yet obtained their degree at Sapienza) and by 19 December 2026 (for students who have not yet obtained their degree from other Italian or international universities).

For students from abroad and/or holding a qualification obtained within a foreign education system

The procedures for students from abroad are set out in point 6.

2. Admission requirements

Admission to the Master's degree programme in Chemical Engineering requires a three-year bachelor's degree or other qualification obtained in Italy or abroad and recognised as eligible under current legislation.

Applicants must also meet the academic requirements and demonstrate adequate personal knowledge.

The academic requirements stipulate that a minimum of 99 CFU must have been obtained in the following subject areas:

- at least 42 CFU in the following scientific subject areas (SSD) within the disciplinary field of core subjects: CHEM* (formerly CHIM/*), PHYS* (formerly FIS/*), IINF-05/A (formerly ING-INF/05), MATH* (formerly MAT/*), of which at least 18 CFU must be in the MATH* (formerly MAT/*) SSD;
- at least 42 CFU in the following SSDs within the disciplinary field of core chemical engineering subjects: ICHI-01*, ICHI02*, IIND-03/C, IMAT-01/A (formerly ING-IND/21-27), of which at least 24 CFU must be in the SSDs ICHI-01* and ICHI02* (formerly ING-IND/24-27);
- at least 15 CFU in the following SSDs within the disciplinary fields characterising industrial engineering: CEAR-06/A (formerly ICAR/08), IIND-01/F (formerly ING-IND/06), IIND-06/A (formerly ING-IND/08), IIND-06/B (formerly ING-IND/09), IIND-07/A (formerly ING-IND/10), IIND-07/B (formerly ING-IND/11), IMIS-01/A (formerly ING-IND/12), IIND-02/A (formerly ING-IND/13), IIND-03/A (formerly ING-IND/14), IIND-03/B (formerly ING-IND/15), IIND-04/A (formerly ING-IND/16), IIND-05/A (formerly ING-IND/17), IIND-07/D (formerly ING-IND/19), CEAR-02/B (formerly ING-IND/28), ILET-01/A (formerly ING-IND/31), IIND-08/A (formerly ING-IND/32) and IIND-08/B (formerly ING-IND/33).

Academic requirements are assessed based on certification of the examinations taken during the student's university studies; any missing credits may be obtained through individual modules. In any case, the credits required to meet the academic requirements must be obtained prior to enrolment.

The Area Educational Board reserves the right to assess the content of the courses taken for the purposes of recognising equivalence.

Assessment of an applicant's academic background is carried out by considering the results achieved in obtaining the qualification used to gain admission to the programme, in accordance with the procedures set out in the programme's academic regulations.

It is also required that those enrolling are able to use the English language fluently, both in writing and orally. These language skills, equivalent to a B2 level of the CEFR or specific TOEFL test scores, are assessed in accordance with the procedures described in the programme's academic regulations for Italian citizens and EU citizens, as well as for non-EU citizens.

3. Verification of eligibility

Eligibility checks must be requested by paying a €10.00 fee from 2 July 2026 and by one of the following dates, as chosen:

- 15 September 2026 (the only applicable date for applicants from non-EU countries requiring a student visa)
- 15 October 2026
- 17 November 2026
- 17 December 2026
- 14 January 2027 (date reserved for students who have already graduated from Sapienza or are about to graduate).

The payment is generated via the Infostud system.

The result of the eligibility check will be sent to your institutional email account (if active) or to the personal email address provided on Infostud.

4. Assessment of personal knowledge

The assessment of the suitability of a student's academic background is carried out based on a weighted average, calculated using all the credits with marks required to obtain a bachelor's degree: personal knowledge is considered appropriate if this weighted average is 22.50/30 or higher, or if the candidate passes a specific assessment of personal knowledge relating to the core subjects of chemical engineering, organised by the CAD (Area Educational Board) in accordance with the procedures described on the dedicated page of the CAD website.

A good command of written and spoken English is also required, which is assessed based on attainment of level B2 (CEFR – Common European Framework of Reference for Languages) or specific scores in the TOEFL test or equivalent certification.

Language proficiency may also be recognised if a B2-level language course is successfully completed as part of the first-cycle degree programme, or through attendance at advanced language courses offered by the Faculty, provided the relevant test is passed prior to enrolment.

The certifications recognised by the Faculty, corresponding to CEFR Level B2, are as follows:

- Cambridge FCE (or higher)
- IELTS level 6 (or higher)
- TOEFL internet-based 72 (or higher), paper-based 513 (or higher), or computer-based 183 (or higher)
- Trinity ISE2 (or higher)

These language skills are assessed in accordance with the procedures described in the course's academic regulations, which apply to Italian students, students from the European Union and international students.

The procedures for assessing the suitability of personal knowledge, which are only available to those who meet the academic requirements, are set out in the academic regulations, available on the degree programme's website.

5. Enrolment

Enrolment is granted upon payment of the course enrolment fees, following the successful completion of the assessment of entry requirements and personal knowledge.

The payment slip is generated via the Infostud system.

6. For students who hold a qualification from a foreign education system

The procedures vary depending on citizenship and country of residence.

For citizens of non-EU countries who reside abroad and are applying for a student visa, and for students from China participating in the Marco Polo programme who have chosen the English-language programme

In these cases, you must hold a mandatory letter of pre-acceptance.

For citizens of non-EU countries who reside abroad and are applying for a student visa, and for students from China participating in the Marco Polo project who have chosen the Italian-language programme

In this case, a letter of pre-acceptance is not required, but you must **pass the Italian language proficiency test** (level B2), or submit a certificate of proficiency in Italian at a level no lower than B2, as indicated in point 1 on the International Students' Office page. This requirement applies only to those applying for enrolment on a degree programme taught in Italian
