1. Stages of the procedure

To be admitted to the programme, you must:

- a. **Pay** the fee of €10.00 in accordance with the procedures and deadlines set out in point 3.
- b. **Wait for the outcome** of the eligibility check. **If you do not meet the entry requirements**, you may acquire the missing credits by passing single examinations.
The procedures and costs are set out in the section 'Single Examinations' of the Regulations for Attendance at Bachelor's and Master's Degree Programmes and for Student Fees

- c. **Carry out the personal skills assessment** in accordance with the procedures set out in point 4.
- d. **Proceed with enrolment** by paying the course enrolment fees in accordance with the procedures and deadlines set out in point 5.
Enrolment can only take place once the Student Affairs Office has sent an email confirming the successful outcome of the eligibility and personal knowledge checks.

For students coming from other Italian universities

Students coming from other Italian universities must, after paying €10.00, submit a self-declaration stating the exams they have taken, the scientific-disciplinary sectors corresponding to the courses, and the relevant syllabuses, using the form "Dichiarazione laurea ed esami per verifica dei requisiti" available on the University website, on the student forms page

The declaration must be submitted in one of the following ways:

- from the email address provided on Infostud at the time of registration, to the email address of your Student Affairs Office or to the address specified in the curriculum requirements, available in the degree programme catalogue on the page for each programme under the 'Enrolment' section. Before submitting your application, you must check that you have uploaded your identity document to Infostud, under 'Profile > Personal Documents';
- from your certified email address to Sapienza's certified email address protocollosapienza@cert.uniroma1.it

For students who have not yet obtained their degree

Where the course regulations so provide, students who have not yet obtained their degree (at Sapienza or at other universities) may also apply for verification of their eligibility, subject to the requirement to obtain it by 23 January 2027 (for students who have not yet obtained their degree at Sapienza) and by 19 December 2026 (for students who have not yet obtained their degree from other Italian or international universities).

For students from abroad and/or holding a qualification obtained within a foreign education system

The procedures for students from abroad are set out in point 6.

2. Admission requirements

Admission to the Master's degree programme in Safety Engineering and Civil Protection requires candidates to meet academic entry requirements, which entail an adequate command of the general scientific methods and content specific to the basic scientific disciplines and engineering disciplines – as a foundation for the core and related subjects set out in the Master's degree programme regulations – as well as proficiency in the English language. In particular, the academic requirements for admission to the Master's degree programme in Safety Engineering and Civil Protection are:

- a good command of the English language, both written and spoken, equivalent to level B2 (CEFR – Common European Framework of Reference for Languages), which must be demonstrated by the student through specific certification or by passing an assessment of their proficiency. Language proficiency may be recognised if the student has passed a B2-level language course during their first-cycle degree programme or by attending the advanced language courses offered by the Faculty and passing the relevant test prior to enrolment.

The certifications recognised by the Faculty, corresponding to CEFR Level B2, are as follows:

- Cambridge FCE (or higher)
- IELTS Level 6 (or higher)
- TOEFL: Internet-based 72 (or higher), Paper-based 513 (or higher), or Computer-based 183 (or higher)
- Trinity ISE2 (or higher)

- a minimum of 90 CFU obtained in degree programmes in Engineering (V.O.), namely in Civil and Environmental Engineering or Industrial Engineering, within the compulsory educational activities required by the L-7 degree class in Civil and Environmental Engineering or the L-9 degree class in Industrial Engineering, as specified below:

- a minimum of 30 credits in core subjects:

a) subject areas: Mathematics, Computer Science and Statistics: INF/01 (IINF-01/A), INF/05 (IINF-05/A), MAT/02 (MATH-02/A), MAT/03 (MATH-02/B G), MAT/05 (MATH-03/A), MAT/06 (MATH-03/B), MAT/07 (GSD 02 – Mathematics), MAT/08 (GSD 02 – Mathematics), MAT/09 (MATH-04/A), SECS-S/02 (STAT-01/B);

b) subject areas: Physics and Chemistry: CHIM/03 (CHEM-04/A), CHIM/07 (CHEM-06/A), FIS/01 (PHYS-01/A), FIS/03 (PHYS-03/A);

- a minimum of 60 credits in the core educational activities characterising the civil and environmental engineering (L-7) and industrial engineering (L-9) degree programmes:

a) subject area: safety and civil protection, environmental and land-use engineering: ICAR/02 (CEAR-01/B), ICAR/06 (CEAR-04/A), ICAR/07 (CEAR-05/A), ICAR/08 (CEAR-06/A), ICAR/09 (CEAR-07/A), ICAR/11 (CEAR-08/B), ING-IND/11 (IIND-07/B), ING-IND/28 (CEAR-02/B);

b) subject area: safety engineering and industrial protection: ING-IND/10 (IIND-07/A), ING-IND/14 (IIND-03/A), ING-IND/16 (IIND-04/A), ING-IND/17 (IIND-05/A), ING-IND/21 (IIND-03/C), ING-IND/22 (IMAT-01/A), ING-IND/25 (ICHI-02/A), ING-IND/31 (IINET-01/A), ING-IND/33 (IIND-08/B);

c) subject area: environmental and land-use engineering: BIO/07 (BIOS-05/A), CHIM/12 (CHEM-01/B), GEO/02 (GEOS-02/B), GEO/05 (GEOS-03/B), GEO/11 (GEOS-04/B), ICAR/01 (CEAR-01/A), ICAR/03 (CEAR-02/A), ICAR/05 (CEAR-03/B), ICAR/20 (CEAR-12/A), ING-IND/24 (ICHI-01/B), ING-IND/27 (ICHI-02/B), ING-IND/29 (CEAR-02/C), ING-IND/30 (CEAR-02/D);

d) subject area: energy engineering: ING-IND/08 (IIND-06/A), ING-IND/09 (IIND-06/B), ING-IND/19 (IIND-07/D), ING-IND/32 (IIND-08/A).

If the mandatory enrolment requirements are not met, it is possible to fulfil the necessary requirements prior to enrolment by taking single examinations in accordance with the University's Academic Regulations.

For students holding a degree from a foreign university, or who do not hold a degree in Engineering (V.O.) or in Civil and Environmental Engineering or Industrial Engineering, the assessment of curricular requirements will be carried out by considering appropriate equivalences between the modules successfully completed and those corresponding to the specified scientific-disciplinary areas. Assessment of personal knowledge will be carried out in accordance with the procedures set out in the degree programme's academic regulations.

3. Verification of eligibility

Eligibility checks must be requested by paying a €10.00 fee from 2 July 2026 and by one of the following dates, as chosen:

- 15 September 2026 (the only applicable date for applicants from non-EU countries requiring a student visa)
- 15 October 2026
- 17 November 2026
- 17 December 2026
- 14 January 2027 (date reserved for students who have already graduated from Sapienza or are about to graduate).

The payment is generated via the Infostud system.

The **payment** is made online via PagoPA (direct payment).

The **code** to be entered into the system is **33491**.

The result of the eligibility check will be sent to your institutional email account (if active) or to the personal email address provided on Infostud.

4. Assessment of personal knowledge

The assessment of personal knowledge is carried out once the entry requirements have been met.

The procedures for assessing the suitability of personal knowledge – which are open only to those who meet the academic requirements – are set out in the Academic Regulations, available on the degree programme's website.

5. Enrolment

Enrolment is granted upon payment of the course enrolment fees, following the successful completion of the assessment of entry requirements and personal knowledge.

6. For students who hold a qualification from a foreign education system

The procedures vary depending on citizenship and country of residence.

For citizens of non-EU countries who reside abroad and are applying for a student visa, and for students from China participating in the Marco Polo programme who have chosen the English-language programme

In these cases, you must hold a mandatory letter of pre-acceptance.

For citizens of non-EU countries who reside abroad and are applying for a student visa, and for students from China participating in the Marco Polo project who have chosen the Italian-language programme

In this case, a letter of pre-acceptance is not required, but you must **pass the Italian language proficiency test** (level B2), or submit a certificate of proficiency in Italian at a level no lower than B2, as indicated in point 1 on the International Students' Office page. This requirement applies only to those applying for enrolment on a degree programme taught in Italian

For students who are Italian citizens, citizens of EU countries (regardless of their country of residence) and citizens of non-EU countries holding a residence permit in Italy
